Carbon Monoxide Warning Stickers


New Minnesota requirement may apply to your boat

Effective May 1, 2017: A total of three carbon monoxide (CO) warning stickers are required for all gasoline-powered motorboats with an enclosed occupancy compartment* while operating on Minnesota waters. The appropriate sticker must be placed at the:

• helm (steering station) • stern • cabin (in or at the entrance to the enclosed occupancy compartment) Stickers are not required, but are strongly recommended on the following watercraft:

- Diesel-powered motorboats: Display the stickers at the helm, stern, and if applicable, in the cabin.
- Open motorboats: Display the "helm" and "stern" warning stickers.
- Boats with canvas or three sided enclosures: Display all three stickers.
- Enclosed occupancy compartment: One contiguous enclosed space surrounded by boat structure that may be occupied by a person.




